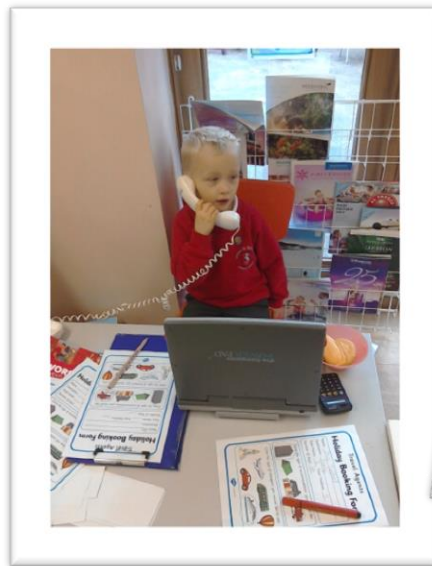
**What we are learning about in class...**

### Wrens

Last week the Wrens focused on space travel and read the story 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy in which a bear flies to the moon. We explored moon sand and acted out the story. They also impressed by learning the basics of addition!

This week we have been thinking about travelling on holiday. Our bus station role play area was transformed into a travel agents. This play area has really inspired the children to write! In Maths we have learnt about different coins and have begun to consider their values.

This week we have been continuing our learning investigating how animals are similar and different. We learnt about birds on Monday, we looked at their feathers and different types of birds. Then we had lots of fun with the clay, we chose an animal from the bird, reptile, amphibian or fish family and started our clay masterpieces, we hope to paint them before our open afternoon on Monday.

We have started reading The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch in English and have written to Mr Grinling asking him what his favourite sandwich is, we are eagerly awaiting his response!

### Attendance News

As you will be aware from the letter we sent home, we are taking part in the Kent County 'Project 95' Scheme. This is designed to assist schools and families in improving attendance at school which is so important for your child to make good progress in their learning and to get the very best from their education. We are therefore monitoring attendance closely and sharing that data with Colette Todman, the Education Liaison Officer. Overall attendance at school is currently



93.5% which is lower than the government target of 95%. We understand that children can become unwell and a period of absence can cause quite a dramatic drop in your child's attendance. We are here to offer help and support with any issues which may be affecting your child's attendance at school as we, like you, want the very best for your children.



There are an increasing number of occasions where children are either arriving late for school in the mornings or are late being collected at the end of the day. Gates open at 8.35 and children are supervised until they go indoors at 8.45. **All children must be in class by 8.50 ready for registration.** Late arrivals must be signed in at the school office by the parent/carer - please do not send children in alone. The school day finishes at 3.15.
