What we are learning about in class...

Wrens

The Wrens have returned from the half term break happy and ready to learn. We have begun this term's topic on Fairy Tales. If your child has a favourite fairy tale at home please bring it in for us to share at story time. We worked together to build a fairy tale castle role play area. The children applied what they had learnt about repeating patterns to decorate a crown. Next week we will focus on The Three Billy Goats Gruff. There will be lots of bridge building and some gruesome troll masks!

We have embraced the return to school and jumped straight in creating our own Adinkra printing from Western Africa. We worked in pairs to help each other and looked at many different African prints to inspire us. We are looking at Little Red Riding Hood for the next two weeks; the children are already enjoying the story and experiences linked to it. Our classroom was decorated over the break and is now looking lovely and bright and fresh! A big 'thank you' to Mr Linkins for his hard work!

Welcome back, we hope you had an enjoyable half-term!

In Literacy this term we are starting our new text which is, 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe.' The class have been busy planning their fact sheet based on lions which they will be producing on the computers using Publisher.

In maths we will be looking at interpreting and analysing data, collecting data and producing their own graphs.

We will also be looking into our new topic which is linked to Asia, with a big focus on India. Thank you for the India homework that has been sent in already.

In RE we will be focussing on the role of a vicar within the Christian church and will then move on to learn about Shrove Tuesday, Lent and of course Easter as well as planning and rehearsing for the Easter service which Martins will be leading.

In PE we are starting a dance topic involving characterisation that will fit in with this terms class text "The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe".

Buster's Book Club – guess who are district 'Spring Challenge Day' winners...


