Science:

- Compare similarities and differences of local UK area & contrasting non-EU area (Canada/African town/village) (Bitesize: day in the life of Kenyan child)
- Dangerous weather around the world

- Online shopping for fruits (identify origin)
- Google map – aerial views & identify distance from UK to Kenya
- Email schools (typing & mouse skill, Esafety)
- Paint - sunset picture

Design Technology:

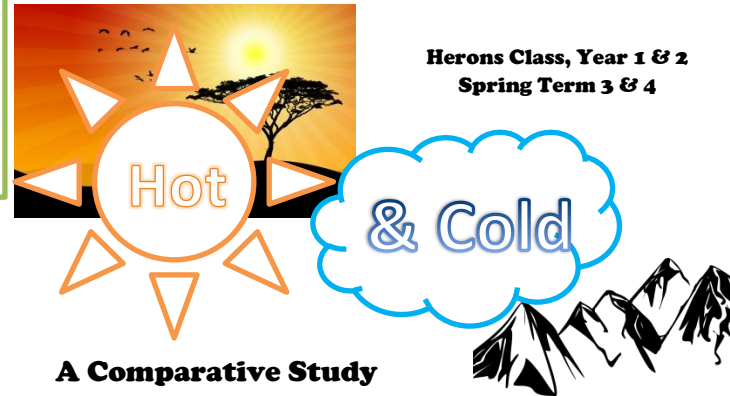
- Fruits from around the world – making fruit skewers (healthy eating & hygiene & senses)
